ahead and make those changes because everybody agrees those are necessary.

SENATOR STONEY: So you are making changes in 5, 14, 17, 19 and 24 and the new language in section 21.

SENATOR HOAGLAND: We are simply striking all those things. That's right, we are just taking them out of the bill, that's all.

SENATOR STONEY: With the exception of 21 and you are removing the new language in that section.

SENATOR HOAGLAND: And we are removing some of the new language in....well, on line 19 and 20 of page 28 of that section.

SENATOR STONEY: Will these all be explained so that we understand what the change is in each?

SENATOR HOAGLAND: Sure, I would be happy to explain. But I think the important thing to understand is that we are simply taking out the substantive changes and going back to the existing law as the safest way to handle this.

SENATOR STONEY: Thank you, Senator Hoagland. Well, Mr. President, after we have an opportunity to hear what the suggested changes are in this revision, I would ask for a division of the question so that we vote on each, rather than take them in totality.

PRESIDENT: All right, I guess that is possible. Well, before we vote we will take a look at that....I have got this.....Senator Lewis, do you want to speak to this point of division?

SENATOR LEWIS: No, Mr. President, I just wanted to....

PRESIDENT: We have several other speakers on....

SENATOR LEWIS: Okay, then I am not in order, I'm sorry.

PRESIDENT: Yes, that's right. Senator Murphy. The Chair recognizes Senator Murphy.

SENATOR MURPHY: Well, I guess I agree substantively with what has been said by Senator Lewis and Senator Schmit, and as far as the urgency of striking the substantive sections which is going to be done without public hearing
