PRESIDENT: Has everybody returned to your desks? All right, the next bill then on Final Reading is LB 686.

CLERK: Mr. President, I have a motion on the desk.

PRESIDENT: Read the motion.

CLERK: Senator Cullan moves to return LB 686 to Select File for a specific amendment. The amendment would read as follows: (Read the Cullan amendment as found on page 1292 of the Legislative Journal.)

PRESIDENT: The Chair recognizes Senator Cullan.

SENATOR CULLAN: Mr. President and members of the Legislature, these amendments....and I ask you to bring this bill back to adopt these amendments....these amendments are of a technical nature and are intended to reflect the intent of the committee amendments and we would...I guess there was an error made in the process as far as the amendments are concerned and they are not intended to change the intent of the committee, so we would simply ask you to return them for that purpose.

PRESIDENT: Any further discussion? All right, that will be your opening and closing. The question is the return of LB 686 for the specific purpose of the technical amendments described by Senator Cullan. All those in favor vote aye, opposed nay. Record the vote.

CLERK: 36 ayes, 10 nays, Mr. President, on the motion to return the bill.

PRESIDENT: The motion carries. The bill is returned. Since this is of a noncontroversial nature we will take it up right now. Senator Cullan, will you move the amendments?

SENATOR CULLAN: Mr. President, I move that the amendments be adopted.

PRESIDENT: All right, motion is to adopt the amendments explained by Senator Cullan. Any discussion? All those in favor of adopting the amendments to LB 686 vote aye, opposed nay. Record the vote.

CLERK: 34 ayes, 0 nays on adoption of Senator Cullan's amendment, Mr. President.
