SENATOR MARSH: While we are waiting for people to arrive I would like to make the announcement that Committee on Committees meets promptly at 12:10 today. Thank you.

SPEAKER MARVEL: Thank you. You said promptly at ten after twelve? You are an optimist. There are five absent so there are six missing. Senator Powers, Senator Koch, Senator Dworak, Senator Newell, Senator Labeledz. Senator Dworak, Senator Newell and Senator Labeledz, Mr. Sergeant at Arms. You are here. Okay. Newell and Dworak, right? Here is Senator Dworak. Okay, we are ready for the... Clerk, call the roll. Yes, you want to read the amendment?

CLERK: Mr. President, Senator Reutzel moves to amend the Vickers amendment to include at least thirty hours in forensic pathology. (Read the roll call vote as found on page 1298 of the Legislative Journal.) 15 ayes, 23 nays, Mr. President.

SPEAKER MARVEL: The motion lost. Do you have anything to read in?

CLERK: Yes, sir, I do. Mr. President, I have a series of interim study resolutions: 241 by the Urban Affairs Committee, the purpose being to establish Housing Authorities in the State of Nebraska as passed in 1969. (See page 1298 of the Legislative Journal.) LR 242 by Senator Goodrich. Purpose: To confront increasing capital requirements for streets and sewer systems of cities of all classes. (See page 1299 of the Legislative Journal.) LR 243 by Senator Nichol and Stoney, the purpose being to examine the desirability and possible ramifications of legislation granting the statutory right to grandparents to seek visitation of their grandchildren. (See pages 1299 and 1300 of the Legislative Journal.) LR 244 by Senator Stoney, the purpose being to examine the arson laws in the State of Nebraska. (See page 1300 of the Legislative Journal.) LR 245 by the Public Works Committee, to review the statutes governing the suspension of drivers' licenses, including the reasons for which licenses can be suspended, the methods used to suspend, the reasons by which the suspended licenses
