and I am afraid that it may end up being the directive rather than the limit, and Senator Nichol pointed out maybe the best reason in the world, he said, well that is a week...that is a week's study. It might even be more than that. I think the main goal is to get a couple days in there and get them down here for a couple of days and have some pretty intensive courses and I just think the bill was pretty good without this amendment, and I think the county attorneys that are pushing it feel that way too. So I would oppose the amendment.

SPEAKER MARVEL: Okay, Senator Kahle, do you have some comments? Okay, the motion is the adoption of the... do you want to close?

SENATOR VICKERS: Yes, I think following Senator DeCamp's comments, I think maybe I should make a few comments. Senator DeCamp is saying once again, let's trust him or trust the county attorneys, trust this Council. My amendment says, not to exceed thirty-six hours. It doesn't say that they have to have thirty-six hours. They can have only five if they so desire.

SPEAKER MARVEL: Okay, the motion is the adoption of the Vickers amendment to 790. All those in favor vote aye, opposed no. Have you all voted? If we have a Call of the House we are going to recess. Have you all voted? Record the vote.

CLERK: 26 ayes, 7 nays, Mr. President, on the adoption of Senator Vickers' amendment.

SPEAKER MARVEL: Okay, the motion carried. Now is there anything else on the bill?

CLERK: I have nothing further on the bill, Mr. President.

SPEAKER MARVEL: Whose bill is it? Do you want to advance the bill?

SENATOR FOWLER: No, I would just as soon, as one of the sponsors....I visited with several of the other sponsors. Just as soon pass over it.

SPEAKER MARVEL: Do you want to pass over the bill? Okay. Senator Kelly, do you want to recess us until 1:30.

SENATOR KELLY: Mr. Speaker, I move we recess until 1:30.

SPEAKER MARVEL: All those in favor of that motion say aye.
