SENATOR WARNER: It merely reflects the statute.

SENATOR LEWIS: Okay, thank you. I have about two or three more here. In terms of program 715 and 781, in terms of our contractual relationships for our students that attend other institutions because of the absence of those types of institutions in the State of Nebraska, is that reflective of an increase or decrease of number of students and was there any discussion in terms of placement problems or in terms of turn downs?

SENATOR WARNER: The amount reflects the University's request which as I understand is the number of positions that we now have. I believe it is 94 contracts. That is from memory. I would have to check for sure but that is within one or two. '99, well, it is within 5.

SENATOR LEWIS: That is not bad.

SENATOR WARNER: There are 99 students. I think last year there was 96, wasn't there? '99 last year, too. Same number, okay, approximately 90.

SENATOR LEWIS: Could I just ask one question...between ninety and a hundred...where are those contracts with? Is it still the same three or four places we have always gone, Mr. Johnson?

SENATOR WARNER: The schools, Iowa State is 54; Kansas State, 21; the University of Minnesota, 12; Oklahoma, 2; and Missouri, 10. Contract cost varies a little bit from institution to institution.

SENATOR LEWIS: Now #781 on optometry, who are we dealing with in that area?

SENATOR WARNER: The list I have doesn't identify the schools' vocation, Senator Lewis, but there were a total, for '79-'80 there was a total of 18 students. Last year, there was... '78, the current year, '79-'80 are 18 students; '78-'79 was 17; '79-'78 was 11; '76-'77 was 37.

SENATOR LEWIS: Mr. Johnson or his staff can provide the name of those schools for us?

SENATOR WARNER: Pardon?
