The more money that goes into the conservation fund, the more we individual farmers benefit. Just imagine, folks, you are putting right in old Schmit's pocket. Now if that doesn't turn you around, nothing will. Money into the development fund, the urban people get a bigger share. Money in the conservation fund goes to individual farms. Now you can't hardly call that a selfish amendment on Senator Sieck's part. I ask you to support the Senator Sieck amendment and I will come back with mine right after that.

SENATOR CLARK: The question before the House is the adoption of the Sieck amendment to 1002. All those in favor vote aye, all those opposed vote nay.

ASSISTANT CLERK: Senator Clark voting aye.

SENATOR CLARK: Have you all voted? Senator Sieck.

SENATOR SIECK: Four excused? How many is excused?

SENATOR CLARK: Seven. If you got all ten of them you'd only have twenty-three.

SENATOR SIECK: You are right. I would like a record vote though.

SENATOR CLARK: A record vote? A record vote has been asked for. Record the vote.
