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number of bushels by some way of metering and testing and determining through AGNETS and others, how much water we actually should put on and this body is not going to allow that to happen through NRDs because NRDs in too many cases are closely related to people who live in that area and they can't afford to get emotionally involved over tough decisions. I suggest this body look at law and a very serious law where we will step in and we will make the final determination because we have some immunity, and, Senator Schmit, I seldom disagree with you and I think I share most of your interests but right now I am a little concerned about your views as it relates to conservation of water and I think it is ironical today you stand here and accuse the Budget Committee of not being fiscally sound and not being concerned about conservation and accuse the rest of us about the same issue and I am waiting for your answer, Senator Schmit, because of what I read in the paper. Maybe you are misquoted but right now you tell me that everyone should be able to use and abuse the water just like they want to because it lays under their land and they can keep pumping until it is gone, then we will all suffer. Thank you.

SPEAKER MARVEL: Senator Powers, did you want to make a comment and ask Senator Schmit a question?

SENATOR POWERS: Yes, sir.

SPEAKER MARVEL: Okay, Senator Schmit. Senator Schmit, Senator Powers wants to ask you a question.

SENATOR SCHMIT: Yes, Senator Powers, what can I sell you?

SENATOR POWERS: Senator Schmit, when I came down here I discovered that water was a very important issue and I look at people like Senator Wagner, Senator Kremer, Senator Sieck with great respect and when you say that we need another million dollars, I listen because you are aware of the situations and so on and what I would like to ask you, have we appropriated an amount of money without your amendment, that has excluded some very necessary projects, the people who work on the water project would like to accomplish? Have we looked at plans for whatever it takes in this water conservation area and have we said, well, gee whiz, no, you can't do x and x. We are giving you just enough money for this over here and your million dollars, what projects have been turned down that would benefit this state because of the lack of enough appropriation?
