

if the defendant loses he has the right to appeal, he posts the \$50 appeal bond, his case goes to the district court, it is heard all over again, he can have a lawyer represent him at that level and in addition if he wants to he requests a jury trial and he gets it. Now, Senator Clark indicated to me that I caused the problem to begin with. The truth of the problem is that I have been trying to circumscribe as best I can the transferability of a small claims case because as Senator Marsh and Senator Chambers have ably pointed out transferability of small claims cases tends to vitiate the meaning of small claims court. This is a solid amendment, I am very pleased that I could bring so many different elements of this body together on this point, and if I could only do it on some issues such as taxes and the like I would feel so much better. I move the bill be returned for the specific amendment.

SPEAKER MARVEL: Motion is to return the bill for a specific amendment. All those in favor vote aye, opposed vote no. Record vote has been requested. Record the vote.

CLERK: 35 ayes, 3 nays, 4 excused and not voting, 7 present and not voting. Vote appears on pages 1337-38 of the Legislative Journal.

SPEAKER MARVEL: The motion is carried, the bill is returned. Senator Johnson, do you want to move adoption of the amendments?

SENATOR JOHNSON: Mr. Speaker, I would move adoption of the amendment.

SPEAKER MARVEL: All those in favor of that motion vote aye, opposed vote no. Record the vote.

CLERK: 33 ayes, 3 nays on the motion to adopt the amendment, Mr. President.

SPEAKER MARVEL: Okay, the motion is carried, the amendment is adopted. Do you want to move....return the bill?

SENATOR JOHNSON: Yes, I would, Mr. Speaker.

SPEAKER MARVEL: All those in favor of returning the bill vote aye, opposed no. Okay say aye, opposed no. Motion carried, the bill is returned. Before we go to the next bill in the north balcony from Senator Kahle and Senator Cope's district it is my pleasure to introduce 77 fourth grade students from Northeast School, Kearney, Nebraska, Mrs. Marg True the teacher. Raise your hands so we can
