You have got to give them good solid information and then get out of their way because they will go and do the job for you. Now, for that reason I am opposing the Simon motion. Thank you.

SENATOR CLARK: Senator DeCamp. Question has been called for do I see five hands? Senator Simon, for what reason do you arise?

SENATOR CLARK: I'm afraid that I will have to agree with you.

SENATOR SIMON: Thank you, sir.
