lobbying on this bill. If this happens we could still shift support of education or other entities to other forms of taxation except if they do like California did, they impose on four fifths of the Legislature which would require forty votes to change the system of taxation. If a super limit is imposed I think it will be extremely difficult or if not impossible to get a viable tax system to maintain local government. I think we had better accept a few pains, go to the bother and get the voters to vote off the lid rather than take it off right here in the Legislature. We are risking an impetus for a constitutional amendment if we clean this off as LB 627 presently does. The other provisions along with the one year deal just wipe it off and the voters aren't going to take it lightly, those that aren't here today. I thank you for your time and urge you to accept a two year limitation.
