twenty percent in the economic feasibility study would be for recreational benefits, would this preclude the flood control project from going ahead?

SENATOR DeCAMP: Absolutely not in my opinion providing it was a legitimate floor control project as you are describing but you can't...I suspect you would run into trouble if you simply....

SENATOR DWORAK: I am saying in the second illustration, Senator DeCamp, there is only eighty percent legitimacy or there is only ninety percent legitimacy in the area of economic feasibility, then are they precluded now from building that project that they have to use a ten or a twenty percent recreational factor to get a hundred percent feasibility?

SENATOR DeCAMP: No, I am sure that would not be the case.

SENATOR DWORAK: Then what about fifty percent, Senator DeCamp, it is a fifty-fifty deal?

SENATOR DeCAMP: Well, I guess this is as Senator Murphy says like...no, I had better not. Anyway...

SENATOR DWORAK: See, I am not sure what we are doing here with this amendment and I have talked about this with people lobbying this bill and I am in one hundred percent agreement with the concept but I am really nervous about this when a project is what you might call borderline in the area of a hundred percent feasibility or not but it is legitimate ninety percent or it is a legitimate eighty percent. Is that what we want to do, preclude those type of projects even though they are eighty percent beneficial for flood control?

SENATOR DeCAMP: No, and I said absolutely not. What was the triggering...what was the triggering reason for even doing this? Was it flood control? If the triggering reason, the motivation, was a flood control project, I think that answers the question.

SENATOR DWORAK: Well, then I guess my question then, the next question is what is major reason? How do we determine major reasons? Is that fifty-one percent in an economic feasibility study or what is the major...how do you get to be major if it is not a hundred percent or solely, and if it isn't a hundred percent or solely, then what means major? And I think this is important in this concept,
