ificate of inspection approval for vehicles subject to the provisions of Section 60-320. Which vehicles are in fact subject to the provisions of 60-320? I don't have that statute in front of me and it is not attached to the amendment. Could you explain, Senator Haberman, which vehicles specifically fall under that section of law?

SENATOR HABERMAN: Those that all fall underneath it now, Steve. I can't answer your question specifically. The only thing...

SENATOR FOWLER: Okay. Let me go on then, okay, then it goes on to say, "and owned by motor vehicle dealers subject to Section 60-1401 to 60-1435." It cites some thirty-four sections of law. Could you clarify for me what those sections of law indicate?

SENATOR HABERMAN: Yes.

SENATOR FOWLER: 60-1401 to 60-1435.

SENATOR HABERMAN: One of those sections, Steve or Senator Fowler, one of those sections exempts new car dealers and so many licensed new cars from the inspection statutes.

SENATOR FOWLER: Which one, which one does that, which of those thirty-four sections does that?

SENATOR HABERMAN: I would say that it was 60-1401 to 60-1435.

SENATOR FOWLER: And is that all those sections do, Senator Haberman?

SENATOR HABERMAN: I can't answer your question, Senator.

SENATOR FOWLER: Okay, and then one final question. It indicates, "such temporary certificate of inspection shall be valid for the same period as that provided in Section 60-1703". Senator Haberman, what is that period of time specified in that statute?

SENATOR HABERMAN: Twelve months.

SENATOR FOWLER: Twelve months, okay. It seems to me that perhaps on at least two of the three section citations here that we do not have clear enough information to really act on this. It is easy to adopt an amendment that refers to other sections but I think it is important that we
