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understand what those other sections say. Now when Senator Haberman can provide copies of 60-320 and 60-1401 to 60-1435, when we have in front of us the full section of law, then I think we should consider readvancing the bill, but at this time I don't think the debate, when we debated it on Final Reading and there is opportunity for explanation when we adopt the amendment, there is not a full clarification of what statutes we were talking about, and I think that it would be prudent not to advance this bill and to wait for Senator Haberman to bring in a full explanation. It would be terribly embarrassing for all of us to find this bill back on Final Reading and discover that in fact we may have by referencing some thirty-six, thirty seven other sections of law, we may have done more than we intended. The amendment is one paragraph but it covers, as I indicate, thirty-seven sections of law. That is fairly broad, that is a fairly broad action without the full information. I would hope that we would not advance this bill until Senator Haberman can provide us with full explanation of the laws that we are discussing.

SPEAKER MARVEL: Senator Beutler, for what purpose do you rise?

SENATOR BEUTLER: Just a point of order, Mr. Speaker.

SPEAKER MARVEL: State your point.

SENATOR BEUTLER: With regard to my prior motion, I was talking to Senator Lewis at the time you responded. It was indicated to me that your response was that there was a motion on the floor and, therefore, my motion was out of order, is that correct?

SPEAKER MARVEL: No, no. Your motion that I understood, with the twenty-five motions that are flying around the place, is that you asked that the bill not be advanced and my point to you was that at the appropriate time you can simply vote against the advancement of the bill.

SENATOR BEUTLER: Mr. Speaker, I think there is no motion on the floor for advancement.

SPEAKER MARVEL: There will be. Okay, the original motion... (Gavel) We can't conduct business unless we can have some attention. The original motion is the advancement of the bill. There is another motion on the desk and the Clerk will read that motion.
