SENATOR CLARK: We have another amendment.

SENATOR REUTZEL: I have a couple of questions of Senator Hoagland.

SENATOR HOAGLAND: Yes, Senator Reutzel.

SENATOR CLARK: I think the confusion was that Senator Marvel did not see Senator Lamb's light on so he let him talk instead of you closing. You have never closed but there is an amendment to the bill now. Read the amendment.

CLERK: Mr. President, Senator Haberman moves to amend the bill by striking the Hoagland amendment found on page 1058 of the Journal.

SENATOR CLARK: Senator Haberman.

SENATOR HABERMAN: Mr. President, what I am doing is striking what Senator Hoagland says he had taken out of the bill and that is "other interested party". That is what my motion does and I would ask for the support of the body to vote in favor of striking the amendment.

SENATOR CLARK: All right. Now I don't know who wants to talk on this. I have got about six lights on up here. Senator Reutzel, do you want to talk on this? You were next.

SENATOR REUTZEL: Yes, I guess, this or any part of it. I am not sure anyone knows what is going on but I will try to be germane. Senator Hoagland, a couple of questions. Senator Hoagland, I notice there were no opponents to the bill. Have you discussed this since the monies...there is some intermingling monies here with the Game and Parks Department, have you discussed this with them?

SENATOR HOAGLAND: We have had extensive conversations with both Game and Parks and Roads, Senator Reutzel. Now Section 1 has been stricken already. Section 1 of the bill has been taken out earlier by the amendments that we adopted about half hour ago.

SENATOR REUTZEL: Well, I apologize for not being up-to-date on that having been in the Committee on Committees. I assure you I would have much rather been here so any reference to the Game and Parks funding has been deleted?
