The workers of this state are expected to get along on 8% increase of money, with double digit inflation up to 18%. I don't think that we are being fair to them at all. But certainly we are not being fair when we put this much more money in ETV, when certainly in my estimation can get along without it. Thank you.

SPEAKER MARVEL: Senator Lamb.

SENATOR LAMB: Mr. President, members of the Legislature, I rise to support Senator Schmit's amendment. I am a little bit surprised at the testimony by Senator Dworak, because I'm sure that deep down in his heart he could find reason for cutting this budget at least some, maybe not the full amount. But when I have little old ladies come up to me at home, while I am home, and express their disenchantment with the coverage of the ETV of the legislature, I think that maybe this is certainly in order. The complaint seems to be that we see a lot of the staff, and I realize that I'll probably never be on ETV again, but we see the staff members telling the audience what the senator is going to say. Then Senator Vard Johnson gets up and says what he was going to say and if you agree with me, you will agree that Senator Johnson is very capable of saying what he wants to say without being interpreted by staff members of ETV. After Senator Johnson sits down the staff member is again on the tube and tells us what Senator Johnson said. So rather than getting the flavor of the Legislature, we get mostly what the staff people are saying. I would suggest that maybe a good place to cut ETV would be just to cut out the coverage that we have at the Legislature. I don't know if that would be \$700,000 worth but it would certainly be considerable.
