SPEAKER MARVEL PRESIDING

SPEAKER MARVEL: All legislators please return to their seats so we can vote on 905 on Final Reading. Will you record your presence please? All legislators should be in their seats because we are preparing for Final Reading. We've got one more bill to read and then we will revert to the appropriation bills. Senator Nichol, will you record your presence? Senator Pirsch, will you record your presence? Senator Stoney. Good morning, I didn't say anything about recording. Senator Maresh, will you record your presence; Senator Chambers, will you please record your presence; Senator Vickers. Okay, the Clerk will read on Final Reading, LB 905.

CLERK: (Read LB 905 on Final Reading.)

SPEAKER MARVEL: All provisions of law having been complied with, the question is, shall the bill pass. Those in favor vote aye, opposed vote no. Have you all voted? Have you all voted? Clerk, record the vote. Senator Hefner.

SENATOR HEFNER: Point of order.

SPEAKER MARVEL: Yes, sir.

SENATOR HEFNER: On page 1 it has committee down here. That is Revenue Committee. Does that mean that the Revenue Committee heard the bill?

CLERK: Senator, I think the bill originally was referred to Revenue and then was rereferred to Banking. That was the reason for that.

SENATOR HEFNER: Okay, should we have a correction on this?

SPEAKER MARVEL: Senator DeCamp.

SENATOR DE CAMP: Mr. President, I'm willing to take the bill with...I don't think that makes any substantive difference anywhere. Vard would like it returned but I am kind of against it.

SPEAKER MARVEL: Okay, record the vote.

CLERK: (Read record vote as found on page 1493 of the Legislative Journal.) 29 ayes, 13 nays, 6 excused and not voting and 1 present and not voting, Mr. President.
