We all have a responsibility to do what we think is right but somehow when I consider things that various ones of you have told me in the past prevents me from considering that you did what was right today. It was wrong and you know it and it will always be wrong and the one opportunity you had to correct the wrong that was done to black students and black people just as a wrong would be done to Jewish people if Nazi paraphernalia were accepted. The one opportunity that could have shown that that act did not symbolize what this state stands for was allowed to pass. I am opposed to the advancement of this bill.

SPEAKER MARVEL PRESIDING

SPEAKER MARVEL: Senator Schmit, your light is on. Okay, the motion is to advance 999 to E & R for engrossment. All those in favor vote aye, opposed no. Have you all voted? Record the vote.

CLERK: 31 ayes, 5 nays on the motion to advance the bill, Mr. President.

Mr. President, LB 1000 has E & R amendments. That is all I have on the bill.

SPEAKER MARVEL: Senator Wesely.

SENATOR WESELY: Mr. Speaker, I move the E & R amendments to LB 1000.

SPEAKER MARVEL: All those in favor of that motion say aye, opposed no. The motion is carried. The E & R amendment is adopted.
