SENATOR CLARK: Question before the House is the adoption of the Murphy amendment to 1002. All those in favor vote aye, opposed vote nay.

CLERK: Senator Clark voting aye.

SENATOR CLARK: Have you all voted? A record vote has been asked for. Have you all voted? Record your vote.

CLERK: 12 ayes, 21 nays, 7 excused and not voting, 8 present and not voting. Vote appears on page 1512 of the Legislative Journal.

SENATOR CLARK: Motion lost. Senator Carsten, do you have an announcement?

SENATOR CARSTEN: The only thing, Mr. President and members of the Legislature, we are going to have an informational meeting immediately upon adjournment in 1520 on the property tax and the homestead exemption bills.
