PRESIDENT: All right, Senator Haberman asks for a Call of the House. All those in favor of a Call of the House vote aye, opposed nay. Record the vote.

CLERK: 21 ayes, 0 nays to go under Call, Mr. President.

PRESIDENT: The House is under Call. The Sergeant at Arms will bring in all the members who are not in the chamber. All members will return to your desks. All unauthorized personnel will leave the floor. The House is under Call. Record your presence.

SENATOR HABERMAN: Mr. President, let's have a roll call vote and get it over with. Let's go.

PRESIDENT: We've got quite a few people that aren't here. Do you want to go ahead with a roll call vote anyway?

SENATOR HABERMAN: No, we will wait a little while.

PRESIDENT: Okay, you will wait and then we will vote. All right. Senator Kremer, Senator Marsh, Senator Nichol, do you want to push your button to show you are here. Senator Clark, Senator Kelly. Senator Clark is right there. Senator Clark, do you want to push your button? Senator Newell and Senator Johnson. Senator Newell and Senator Johnson are not here, Senator Haberman, and Senator Chambers. Do you want to wait until they get here, Senator Haberman? We've got three, Senator Newell, Senator Johnson and Senator Chambers.

SENATOR HABERMAN: A roll call vote and let's go.

PRESIDENT: Ready right now? All right. A roll call vote on the Haberman amendment. Proceed, Mr. Clerk.

CLERK: (Read roll call vote as found on page 1525 of the Legislative Journal.) 16 ayes, 28 nays, Mr. President.

PRESIDENT: Motion fails. Next amendment.

CLERK: Mr. President, I have an amendment from Senator Warner.

PRESIDENT: Senator Warner. The Chair recognizes Senator Warner.

SENATOR WARNER: Mr. Clerk, is that the amendment for page 4?

CLERK: Yes, sir, page 4, line 12.
