SPEAKER MARVEL: Yes. It is my intention to keep going until we cover the agenda.

CLERK: Mr. President, Senator George would like to have a meeting of the Urban Affairs Committee underneath the north balcony at 3:00.

SENATOR CLARK PRESIDING.

SENATOR CLARK: The Clerk will read the title to LB 882.

CLERK: Read title to LB 882. The bill was read on January 23, 1980, it was referred to the Urban Affairs Committee. The bill was advanced to General File and was . . . was referred to the Revenue Committee, excuse me, and the bill was advanced to General File. There are committee amendments pending by the Revenue Committee, Mr. President.

SENATOR CLARK: Senator Schmit. Oh, Senator Carsten first. You have got some amendments, some committee amendments.

SENATOR CARSTEN: Mr. President, I move for the committee amendments. The committee amendments to LB 882 are really just technical in nature. You will see them in the bill book, it strikes "general taxes" and insert "all property taxes including motor vehicle taxes" and in line 13 after "change" insert "as such are reported pursuant to Section 77-628". These are just technical amendments, do not substantially change the bill at all, but were brought to our attention that needed to be included in the committee amendments. We also struck Section 9 which is the emergency clause, leaving it that if it went into effect immediately it would then be applicable to this year and this year is in place so that if the bill is passed and is signed then it would be in force after July 1st. I move for the adoption of the committee amendment, Mr. President.

SENATOR CLARK: The motion before the House is the adoption of the committee amendments. All those in favor vote aye, those opposed vote nay.

CLERK: Mr. President, Senator Clark voting aye.

SENATOR CLARK: Voting on the committee amendments to 882. Have you all voted? Record the vote.

CLERK: 25 ayes, 0 nays on the adoption of the committee amendments, Mr. President.

SENATOR CLARK: The committee amendments are adopted. Senator Schmit.
