

SENATOR CLARK: The question before the House is the adoption of the Lewis amendment to 882. All those in favor vote aye, all those opposed vote nay.

CLERK: Senator Clark voting no.

SENATOR CLARK: Have you all voted? Have you all voted? The Lewis amendment to 882. Senator Lewis.

SENATOR LEWIS: Mr. President, with all due respect, for the first time this year I'm going to ask for a Call of the House and a roll call vote.

SENATOR CLARK: A Call of the House has been asked for. All in favor vote aye, all those opposed vote nay. Record the vote.

CLERK: 11 ayes, 1 nay to go under Call, Mr. President.

SENATOR CLARK: The House is under Call. All legislators will take your seats and check in please. Will you check in please. Senator Murphy. Senator Kremer, Senator DeCamp, Senator Merz. Senator George, Senator Goodrich, Senator Keyes. Just record your presence please. No questions, no questions, just check in your green button. Senator Haberman. All right, they are all here. Call the roll. Everyone will be in their seats please when he is calling the roll. Senators are in their seats when we call the roll please. The Clerk has got to be able to hear the roll call.

CLERK: Roll call vote. 22 ayes, 20 nays, 3 excused and not voting, 4 present and not voting. Vote appears on pages 1542-43 of the Legislative Journal.

SENATOR CLARK: The motion fails. What is the next one? The Call is raised.

CLERK: Mr. President, Senator Newell now moves to amend the bill.

SENATOR CLARK: Senator Newell, has this been distributed?

SENATOR NEWELL: No, it hasn't.

SENATOR CLARK: A sixteen page amendment?

SENATOR NEWELL: I can get it distributed quickly if you like.

SENATOR CLARK: Go ahead and talk on it.
