

CLERK: 6 ayes, 4 nays to go under Call, Mr. President.

SPEAKER MARVEL: The House is under Call. All Legislators keep your seats, record your presence. Okay, everybody but Senator Hefner.

SENATOR HEFNER: I thought that we were under Call.

SPEAKER MARVEL: We are supposed to be under Call.

SENATOR HEFNER: I think that there is some lobbying around this section.

SPEAKER MARVEL: Those who are unauthorized to be on the floor are asked to leave. That is according to the rules. Yes, I'm ready to leave too, Senator Kahle. The motion is the adoption of the Carsten amendment to 882. Is that correct? Okay, all those in favor of the adoption of, pardon? The motion before the House, as the Chair understands it, is the Carsten amendment to LB 882. Is that correct?

CLERK: Yes, sir, that is correct.

SPEAKER MARVEL: Okay. All those in favor of that motion vote aye, opposed vote no. Have you all voted? Senator Carsten, do you want the vote recorded?

SENATOR CARSTEN: How many are excused?

SPEAKER MARVEL: Two.

SENATOR CARSTEN: Let it go.

CLERK: Record vote, Senator? 19 ayes, 26 nays, 1 present and not voting, 2 excused and not voting, 1 absent and not voting. Vote appears on page 1554 of the Legislative Journal.

SPEAKER MARVEL: Motion lost. Pat, have you got any more motions? Motion lost.

CLERK: Mr. President, the next amendment that I have on the bill is offered by Senator Newell.
