LB 743, 882A

SPEAKER MARVEL: Okay, the motion is advance 882A to E & R for Review. All those in favor of that motion vote aye, opposed no. This is the A bill. 882A. A record vote has been requested. I am sorry, who requested the record vote?

CLERK: Senator Cullan.

SPEAKER MARVEL: Senator Cullan, okay. Record the vote.

CLERK: (Read record vote as found on page 1578 of the Legislative Journal.) 27 ayes, 12 nays, Mr. President, on the motion to advance the A bill.

SPEAKER MARVEL: The motion is carried. The A bill is advanced. What is the next motion? Senator Lewis, do you have a motion? Senator DeCamp, do you have a motion?

SENATOR DeCAMP: It's supposed to be up there somewhere... reconsider on Final Reading the failure of whatever that bill was, 743.

SPEAKER MARVEL: The Clerk will read the motion.

CLERK: Senator DeCamp moves to reconsider the body's action on Final Reading of LB 743.

SPEAKER MARVEL: Senator DeCamp.

SENATOR DeCAMP: Mr. President, I move to reconsider LB 743. It takes 30 votes. It failed by 22 on Final. That is all.

SPEAKER MARVEL: Are you finished? Senator Lewis.

SENATOR LEWIS: I would ask for the reconsideration. I brought the bill back last time in the accommodation of my good friend, Senator Keyes. He and I are both in the middle of an issue that sometimes we don't want to be in. The bill...the amendment I think is controversial. At Senator Keyes' request I moved that to April 1 of this year with a full way to inform all parties involved...not April 1 of this year...I'm sorry, Senator Keyes, April 1 of next year, where both parties involved ought to negotiate out that situation, and that was one of the purposes of the amendment, and I ask for reconsideration. And I apologize for not being here this morning.

SPEAKER MARVEL: Do you have an amendment?

SENATOR LEWIS: No, just reconsideration.
