SENATOR LABEDZ: Those figures are questionable, the 6,000,000. I just got a call it would be 5,000,000, so I would prefer that this be decided on Select File. We don't have the correct figures.

SENATOR NEWELL: All right, 5,000,000 or 6,000,000, you know, it is only money. We are going to spend it. This proposal is to say that we would be a little more cautious in how fast we move this homestead exemption up since it is the major disqualifier. That is the proposal. I think that it is a reasonable one and it is left for the body to decide whether they agree or whether they think the \$40,000 figure is more appropriate.

SPEAKER MARVEL: Okay, the motion is the adoption of the Newell amendment to the Labeledz amendment. All those in favor of that motion, adoption of the Newell amendment to the Labeledz amendment, vote aye, opposed vote no. Have you all voted? There are three...three excused. Yes. Are there four excused? Who is the fourth? Kremer, yes. The motion is the Newell amendment to the Labeledz amendment. Have you all voted?

SENATOR LABEDZ: (Mike not activated)....vote and a Call of the House. No, just....

SPEAKER MARVEL: The House is under Call now. We haven't released the Call.

SENATOR LABEDZ: I will....record. Let it go.

SPEAKER MARVEL: Record the vote.

SENATOR NEWELL: Could we have a roll call, Mr. President?

SPEAKER MARVEL: Yes, if you want a roll call, you can ask for one.

CLERK: (Roll call vote was read as found on pages 1582 and 1583 of the Legislative Journal.) 19 ayes, 24 nays, Mr. President.

SPEAKER MARVEL: The motion lost. Any other motions?

CLERK: No, I have nothing further to the Labeledz amendment, Mr. President.
