elimination of earning capacity. A person confined to a wheelchair with full use of his arms could still function in a limited manner and still perform a number of jobs. A person without arms may require modification in his dwelling such as light switches, door latches, and so forth. Also such an individual often requires constant attention or assistance of another person. Some of the most simple and routine tasks and functions that we take for granted require the aid of a person with arms. If that other person is the spouse, then the spouse is restricted in earning capacity outside the home. Now the purpose of the second amendment is to provide consistency of internal reference to Section 77-3513. For purposes of continuing exemptions in each succeeding year, the new fifth category of individuals without arms would be treated the same as the other four categories of disabled persons already in Section 77-3508. Otherwise, without this amendment the homeowner granted this exemption would have to annually reapply and demonstrate that he still has no arms. This would, obviously, be a waste of time and money by both the individual and the government. This particular amendment will not change any provisions pertaining to a change in the status of the exemption. It is merely a housekeeping amendment and is not a substantive amendment. I ask for approval of the amendment. Thank you.

SPEAKER MARVEL: Okay, this is on the Chronister amendment. Senator Keyes, do you want to speak to the Chronister amendment?

SENATOR KEYES: Yes, I do. I want...Senator Chronister, I am very glad that you have brought this amendment before this body. It is not going to cost a tremendous amount of money. In the past several years I have taken care of those who are handicapped as much as I could and I am sorry that I didn't get in on this with you. So I would ask you folks to support this. It is a very insignificant amount of money. There will be more people, Senator Chronister, than you think. And now along with it I would like to ask Senator Warner a question.

SPEAKER MARVEL: Senator Warner.

SENATOR KEYES: Senator Warner, the amendment that Senator Chronister is offering will cost just a very few thousand dollars, but I am wondering, Senator Warner, if the bill with the \$40,000 instead of 32, if that is going to be within the seven percent lid as the Governor has so adamantly stated that he is going to follow.
