SPEAKER MARVEL: Okay, we have got Senator Venditte, Senator Labeledz, Senator DeCamp. Do you want to be recognized, Senator Venditte? Senator Labeledz. The motion is the kill motion on 608. As soon as we dispose of this we are going to adjourn.

SENATOR LABEDZ: I support the kill motion naturally. We had this same problem two years ago when both bills were advanced to the floor. In the interest of time...now if LB 647 isn't going to go the way it went this morning, we still have Select File. I believe that only one should be advanced. There is ample time for any amendments on 647 when it gets to Select File. I strongly support the kill motion.

SPEAKER MARVEL: Senator DeCamp.

SENATOR DeCAMP: Oh, I think if they talked nice to Rex he would pull his kill motion and let them vote to advance it. Wouldn't you, Rex? So they can get that done? No. I think it will make a good district election repeal bill eventually, so....

SPEAKER MARVEL: Senator Hefner.

SENATOR HEFNER: Mr. President and members of the body, I would just like to echo my opposition to the kill motion because I think this is a good bill. I think this is a good bill. The Revenue Committee heard testimony on it, both for it and against it. But in analyzing it, it looks to me like it would probably be the better of the two bills.
