LR 216, 217, 219, 220

PRESIDENT: The motion carries and LR 216 is adopted. The next one is LR 217, Mr. Clerk.

CLERK: Mr. President, LR 217 by Senator Koch. (Read LR 217.)

PRESIDENT: The Chair recognizes Senator Koch.

SENATOR KOCH: Mr. President, members of the body, each year there is competition to recognize the outstanding teacher of the State of Nebraska. In this case it is a privilege to recognize Marj Tabor and I will tell you why. It is because I know her personally. My grandson attended Millard Elementary School and she was one of his teachers and to this day even though they live in Minnesota they still think she is one of the most outstanding people and I do too and I ask for the adoption of this amendment.

PRESIDENT: All right, is there any further discussion on LR 217? The question then is the adoption of LR 217. All those in favor vote aye, opposed nay. Record the votes.

CLERK: 34 ayes, 0 nays, Mr. President.

PRESIDENT: Motion carries and LR 217 is adopted. The next resolution is LR 219.

CLERK: LR 219 by Senator Hefner. (Read LR 219.) Mr. President, that is found on page 1241 of the Journal.

PRESIDENT: The Chair recognizes Senator Hefner.

SENATOR HEFNER: Mr. President and members of the body, with this resolution I am recognizing Cedar Catholic High at Hartington. This is located in northeast Nebraska in my legislative district. Also I want to talk about the next resolution also, 220. This is recognizing Hartington High for their runner-up spot in Class C and what is unique about this, both of these schools are located in a community of only sixteen hundred population. Cedar Catholic did have a record, a season record of twenty-five wins and no losses. Hartington High was runner-up in Class C State Boys Basketball Tournament here in Lincoln. They ended the season with twenty-one wins and four losses. Fremont Bergen was the only team that was the team that defeated them for the Class C championship. That is in Senator Reutzel's district but anyway, ninety-six boys got to play in the state championship finals here in Lincoln and twenty-four of these boys were from Hartington. I think that is quite a record. I would urge you to vote for these two resolutions and, Mr. Chairman, I move for the adoption of LR 219.
