PRESIDENT: The Chair recognizes Senator Chambers.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Mr. Chairman, I think the resolution speaks for itself. It had a public hearing and was advanced by the Banking Committee. I move for its adoption.

PRESIDENT: Anything further on LR 43. If not, Senator Chambers, that is your opening and closing too? So all those in favor of LR 43 vote aye, opposed nay. Have you all voted? Record the vote.

CLERK: 28 ayes, 0 nays, Mr. President.

PRESIDENT: Motion carries and LR 43 is adopted. We are ready then for agenda item #6, Committee on Committees report. The Chair recognizes Senator Marsh.

CLERK: Mr. President, I have four such reports. The first is on page 1350.

SENATOR MARSH: Mr. President and members of the Legislature, we will start with page 1350. I recommend the following names for appointment or reappointment: John B. Cassel, Board of Educational Lands and Funds; Roger Cross, Department of Economic Development; Earl Hultman, Games and Parks Commission; Wayne Schreurs, Board of Parole; Jerry Sellentin, State Personnel Board.
