

SENATOR SCHMIT: All right, then on page 10, line 9, it says, section (d), "The board shall compile a listing of the bond indebtedness of power entities in the state." Is there at the present time such a listing or not?

SENATOR WARNER: Well as I recall, and maybe Senator Kelly or someone can assist me, I believe that there was a request a couple of years ago. One of those power review board, one of the power interim studies, that did reflect, did request and did compile this very information so this in effect would be an updating of that.

SENATOR SCHMIT: Well I guess I am a little concerned about a number of those items and for example, if you check on page 9 again, line 16 and 17. "Actual power sales and peak loads of all power suppliers for the current year". Is it possible for them to do this? See, I think they could do it for the previous year but they really can't do it for the current year. For example, it is impossible for them to give an actual record of the power sales for the entire year when you are in a current year. I think the language is incorrect, Senator.

SENATOR WARNER: Well it refers to calendar year, 1980, and I am looking for the date, it is to be submitted not later than January 1st of '81 so that is a 1980 statistic in the event that the last couple of months I suppose couldn't be included by January 1st as a matter of computation but...

SENATOR SCHMIT: But it doesn't really say that. Does it? I guess I am concerned. I am not trying to nitpick, Senator. I think if you look down a little further on that page on line 25, on page 9, "It is further the intent of the Legislature that the board obtain from electrical suppliers in the state a copy of any report concerning future power supply plans or load forecasting or both." It has been my experience that there are many studies that are of a continuing nature and during the course of the period of that study some of those studies have been submitted to the Legislature from time to time at our request and the Executive Board has held a number of studies. I think that if we were to be considerate at the very least and to be honest at the best, we would say that it should be the final report or the concluding report, but you just give a...I don't think we want to be burdened with all of those various reports that come along. The final report is one thing but to be given a copy of any report that happens to come along the line I think is not the intent of the Appropriations Committee and I do not want to put words in anyone's mouth but I think there are a couple of areas here that certainly should be
