PRESIDENT: The Chair recognizes Senator Newell. Okay, the Chair recognizes Senator Schmit.

SENATOR SCHMIT: Mr. President,

PRESIDENT: Yes, I guess, let's see, I guess we are ready for a close on your motion then.

SENATOR SCHMIT: Mr. President and members of the Legislature, I do not disagree with what Senator Kelly is trying to do and Senator Warner and the other members of the committee but I do believe that we will receive a lot more factual information and a lot more definite information if these amendments were adopted. When we speak in terms of the current year it is sort of like asking this Legislature how much money we are going to spend during this current year and until there is a... some kind of finalization that is impossible to do. I would like to withdraw that previous motion to strike Section 10, if I could have unanimous consent and submit instead a new motion. Could we do that, please? If there is no objection I would like to withdraw my previous amendment and submit a new amendment.

PRESIDENT: All right, so you are withdrawing the amendment that we have been debating...?

SENATOR SCHMIT: Yes, I am.

PRESIDENT: ...and resubmitting another amendment.

SENATOR SCHMIT: I don't think Senator Kelly would object to that language.

PRESIDENT: All right, your amendment is withdrawn. Now we are on the new amendment, on the second amendment. Is that right?

CLERK: Mr. President, the Schmit amendment would read as follows:

PRESIDENT: All right, read the amendment.

CLERK: (Read Schmit amendment as found on page 1600 of the Journal.)

PRESIDENT: Senator Schmit.

SENATOR SCHMIT: I believe this would do what the committee would like to do. I believe it fulfills Senator Kelly's concern in regard to being able to find the information that
