SENATOR WARNER: Mr. President, it seems to be that the amendment will be okay. I would like to ask Senator Schmit just for clarification, your amendment on line 25, for final and conclusionary was it?

SENATOR SCHMIT: Conclusionary reports.

SENATOR WARNER: I would ask what your definition might be of those words. I would assume that in some instances future power supplies are never finalized. It is an on-growing thing.

SENATOR SCHMIT: That is why...yes...

SENATOR WARNER: Would it be any report submitted do you think based on your wording?

SENATOR SCHMIT: I would choose to think that it would be a final report or a report which draws a conclusion that you need to construct something, change something, build something. Any report that would call for some kind of an action like that, I believe would be included, Senator Warner, so that we could not...they could not tell us in effect, well we have reached a final decision but if they have reached a decision that calls for a conclusion to bring about some action then I think we should be entitled to that report.

SENATOR WARNER: That seems like a reasonable amendment. I think we would agree or concur in the amendment.

SENATOR SCHMIT: Thank you, Senator Warner.

PRESIDENT: Any further discussion then on the Schmit amendment? I don't see any others that wish to speak on it. If I am incorrect on that let me know. So, Senator Schmit, you may close on that amendment.
