of special fuels that is at the end of the hose as it is usually referred to. Gasoline is now at what I guess we would call the wholesaler although there is another definition by law. That is where the tax is collected just as it is now. The only reference to wholesale and retail, excuse me, the only reference to wholesale in the bill was the mechanism for determining price and in lieu of that what the amendment does, it uses for the basis of what the price of fuels are is the bid price, is the price that the state pays when it purchases bulk sales monthly and the amendment provides the mechanism where those purchases are over one hundred gallons are recorded and filed with the Department of Revenue and that they would be using that as the mechanism to determine value rather than the initial bill's procedure which was tied to the wholesale price. We get away from all that reporting of price from individual distributors.

SENATOR KREMER: Well I understand that. The problem I had is who collects the tax and I think you have now explained it. Now then I would like to continue. You see no problem then in the last part of Section 3 on your amendment reading, allows continuation of all existing exemptions from fuel taxes. You see no problem in allowing the continuation then of exemptions as provided now. You see no problem there.

SENATOR WARNER: No, the way the amendment is adopted, all exemptions remain just as they are now with no change. There is no substantive change that affects anything as we now understand our system other than the mechanism for providing the funding for their approved one year appropriation by the Legislature of the Department of Roads road program.

SENATOR KREMER: Thank you.

SPEAKER MARVEL: Senator DeCamp.

SENATOR DE CAMP: Question.
