LB 637, 1000

Reading, as you apparently do with your vote earlier this year, then I would suggest that everybody get back to your desks and follow along and read this bill so you will know if you want to vote for it. So it is LB 1000. About one-third of you were wandering around during the reading of the last bill. I won't mention how many were following the reading. Go ahead. Final Reading of LB 1000.

CLERK: (Read LB 1000 on Final Reading.)

PRESIDENT: All provisions of law relating to procedure having been complied with, the question is, shall LB 1000 pass with the emergency clause attached? All those in favor vote aye, opposed nay. Record the vote.

CLERK: (Read the record vote as found on page 1625 of the Legislative Journal.) 42 ayes, 2 nays, 2 excused and not voting and 3 present and not voting, Mr. President.

PRESIDENT: LB 1000 passes on Final Reading with the emergency clause attached. Now, as I understand it, Mr. Clerk, we have a motion to reconsider a bill that was...that had previously failed on Final Reading. Is that right? Well, I think that the Speaker had agreed. Is that not correct, Speaker Marvel, that we will go to LB 637. There is a motion by....

SPEAKER MARVEL: This is the last day for that motion to be made, and....

PRESIDENT: Senator DeCamp, I believe it is your motion.

SPEAKER MARVEL: ...and it should have been on the agenda and I neglected to put it on.

PRESIDENT: So we have added that. With the Speaker's permission the agenda has been changed to add the reconsideration of LB 637 and that is a motion...do you want to...have you got the motion, Mr. Clerk? I believe it is the DeCamp motion.

SENATOR DeCAMP: Mr. President, this is a motion to reconsider a bill which failed on Final Reading. It was Senator Maresh's bill commonly called the gasohol bill this year relating to bonding. I had expressed reservations which I still have about the policy of the state guaranteeing bonds of private subdivisions. There are three basic reasons why I am moving to reconsider and why at least for this time I think I could personally live with it. Number one,
