CLERK: Senator Newell changing from yes to no.

SPEAKER MARVEL: Twenty-one are unaccounted for. Senator Wesely, Senator Fowler, Senator Beutler, Senator Maresh, Senator Johnson, Senator Kahle, Senator Dworak, Senator Goodrich, Senator Fitzgerald, Senator Newell...

CLERK: Senator Sieck changing from no to yes. Senator Johnson voting no.
