LB 499, 993, 998, 999, 1001, 1004

There are nine still unaccounted for. Now seven. There are seven that still haven't reported in. Senator Wesely, Senator Schmit, Senator Dworak....yes, call-in votes are accepted, or any other votes as far as that is concerned. Senator Chambers, you need to record your presence. Okay, who asked for....are you ready for the roll call vote? We are down to one person?

SENATOR GEORGE: Yes, thank you.

SPEAKER MARVEL: Okay, call the roll.

CLERK: (Read the roll call vote as found on pages 1641 and 1642 of the Legislative Journal.)

SPEAKER MARVEL: This is the fourth time I have banged the gavel in the last ten minutes. We cannot even hear the roll call up here. Now those of you who wish to proceed for the next few days, finish up the session, would you please cooperate with the Chair and with the Clerk. Otherwise we can't operate. We do appreciate your cooperation. We don't appreciate your noncooperation. Go ahead.

CLERK: (Continued reading the roll call vote.) 18 ayes, 26 nays, Mr. President.

SPEAKER MARVEL: Any other....

CLERK: I have nothing further on this bill, Mr. President. Mr. President, we then go to 1001, and Senator DeCamp moves to return 1001 to Select File for a specific amendment. It is the five percent amendment, Senator.

SENATOR DeCAMP: Mr. President, I don't think five percent cut stands any more chance here than it did anywhere else so I will hold that one too.

CLERK: Okay. I don't have anything further on this bill either, Mr. President.

SPEAKER MARVEL: Okay, we are ready for item #6. The first motion is by Senator Nichol. It is on LB 499. We are on item #6 on the agenda.

CLERK: Mr. President, right before, if I may, Senator Lewis would like to print amendments to 999. Your committee on Enrollment and Review respectfully reports they have carefully examined LB 1004 and recommend that same be placed on Select File, and 993 Select File.
