CLERK: (Read record vote as found on pages 1640 and 1641 of the Legislative Journal.) 16 ayes, 14 nays, Mr. President.

SPEAKER MARVEL: Senator DeCamp, I can't see you. Where did you go to?

SENATOR DeCAMP: Well, I'm hiding. Is this read on Final now, or what happens next?

CLERK: We can't read it because of the A bill bracketing motion, Senator. It has General Fund money in the A bill, and we have to wait until we pass Appropriation bills.

SENATOR DeCAMP: Oh. Are we going to wait on all....I forgot what that motion was exactly, so I understand.

CLERK: I would have to reread it, but we have to pass a majority if not all of the Appropriation bills before we read those A bills.

SENATOR DeCAMP: Oh.

CLERK: Which will be next week.

SENATOR DeCAMP: Hmmmnam.

SPEAKER MARVEL: Okay, the next item is LB 773. Ready for it?

CLERK: Yes, sir. Mr. President, LB 773. Senator Koch moves to return the bill to Select File for a specific amendment, that amendment being to strike the Murphy amendment which we adopted on page 1028 of the Journal and reinserted in the original language.

SPEAKER MARVEL: Senator Murphy, what is your point?

SENATOR MURPHY: Rule 7, Section 7, Mr. Chairman, says any reconsideration, which this is, of a motion must be filed on the same day or the next day, which I understand was complied with but must be disposed of within the next five legislative days. That time has passed, and the rule states specifically that if it has not been taken up in that period of time, then the motion to reconsider shall be considered disposed with.
