LB 346, 615A

I move the return of this bill to Select File for a specific amendment.

SPEAKER MARVEL: Okay, the motion first of all is the return to Select File for a specific amendment as proposed by Senator Johnson. All those in favor of that motion vote aye, opposed vote no. Record the vote.

CLERK: 26 ayes, 0 nays on the motion to return the bill, Mr. President.

SPEAKER MARVEL: Okay, the bill is returned. Now the motion is to adopt the amendment.

CLERK: Yes, sir.

SPEAKER MARVEL: All those in favor of that motion vote aye, opposed vote no. The motion is the adoption of the Johnson amendment. Have you all voted? Record the vote.

CLERK: 25 ayes, 0 nays on adoption of Senator Johnson's amendment.

SPEAKER MARVEL: Okay, the motion is carried. The amendment is adopted. Now the motion is to return...to readvance the bill to E & R for Engrossment. All in favor of that motion say aye. Opposed no. The motion carried. The bill is readvanced. The next motion is....Senator Warner, is this your...is 615A your bill? Senator Warner.

SENATOR WARNER: Mr. President, I move that LB 615A be returned to Select File for a specific amendment. What it is, it is solely a corrective amendment. This is the bill that dealt with the mileage and the A bill had some internal additions that were not correct and it wouldn't really create a problem except that when it comes to audit time there would be some inconsistencies and the amendment adds no dollars in total to it, but it ought to be corrected and there is one word change where the word "Coordination" was used, where it should be "Cooperation". That is merely a misprint, but since there is time to correct it I move that the bill be returned for the adoption of the amendment.

SPEAKER MARVEL: The motion is to return the bill to Select File for the specific amendment as explained by Senator Warner. All those in favor of the motion vote aye, opposed vote no. Okay, record the vote.

CLERK: 31 ayes, 0 nays on the motion to return the bill, Mr. President.
