SENATOR WARNER: Mr. President, I move that the amendment be adopted.

SPEAKER MARVEL: The motion is the adoption of the amendment as explained by Senator Warner. All those in favor vote aye, opposed vote no. Record the vote.

CLERK: 25 ayes, 0 nays on adoption of Senator Warner's amendment.

SPEAKER MARVEL: Okay, the motion is carried. The amendment is adopted. Now the motion is to readvance the bill to E & R for Engrossment. All those in favor vote aye, opposed vote no....say aye. Okay. Opposed no. The motion is carried. The bill is advanced. That completes the list. Now we are on item #7.

CLERK: Mr. President, before we get there, your committee on Enrollment and Review respectfully reports that we have carefully examined LB 995 and find the same correctly re-engrossed.

Mr. President, Senator Hoagland moves to reconsider the body's action on Final Reading of LB 741.

SENATOR HOAGLAND: Mr. Speaker and colleagues, I am sure nobody is tired of the obsolete statute bill than I am, and it is with a great deal of embarrassment and apology that I have to ask the body to reconsider. I would like to do this as quickly as we can, and let me explain why it is necessary. You will recall that on Select File we removed from the obsolete statute bill provisions relating to the repeal of the township ban provision. Well it turns out that in drafting that amendment we made a mistake, and we did not get all of the township ban provisions out of the obsolete statute bill and the way it reads now is that we repeal three of eleven sections relating to township bans, and it was the intent of this body not to repeal any of the sections relating to township bans. It was strictly an error that was made in the drafting of the amendment, and I would ask the body's indulgence in two or three votes here to bring the bill back to Select File to take those three sections, the repealer of those three sections out, readvance it to Final Reading so we can have it reprinted and pass it again on Final Reading next week. I would be pleased to answer any questions anyone may have.
