than any of us with this question and have had to deal with the question of lids in all its ramifications, but I offered this kill motion for a chance for this Legislature to try and focus on the final days on one method of resolving this problem. We can advance 609. We can leave up in the air exactly how we are going to resolve the questions with regards to lids and the difficulties that have been encountered because of locally imposed lids. I think there is an acceptable vehicle on Select File and I think that this Legislature would better serve the people to now start trying to make some decisions than to delay and put those decisions off. For that reason I offer the kill motion. I again wish to say that I am not questioning the sincerity or amount of dedication of any one with this but I do not think this Legislature is well served by deferring decisions and advancing two bills when one can handle the job. For that reason, I move to indefinitely postpone LB 609.

SPEAKER MARVEL: The motion is the indefinite postponement of 609. All those in favor of that motion vote aye, opposed vote no. The motion is to indefinitely postpone the bill. Senator Fowler.

SENATOR FOWLER: Mr. President, if you had recorded the vote when it was eight to seven it might have been okay but I think at this point it is clear. I won't ask for a Call of the House.
