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some particular decision or the way it goes. Urge you to support Senator Sieck.

SENATOR CLARK: Senator Marsh.

SENATOR MARSH: Good afternoon, Senator Clark, thank you very much. Members of this legislative body, I rise to oppose Senator Sieck's amendment. I sometimes think material that is brought to us is directly from the rotunda. I have that strong feeling this time. Having served on the committee which looked at some of the problems which exist in our state I feel that the original amendment which we have offered to us today is what we should be accepting. As Senator Warner said, it is slightly controversial but so is a fresh breath of air. Sometimes lungs might hurt with fresh breath of air. Why can't we give this commission the tools? This amendment which is proposed by Senator Sieck would say, oh, we don't want anything new. We like the way we have people under our thumbs. We want to continue where the money is, where the power is. I strongly oppose Senator Sieck's amendment. I am biting my tongue to keep from saying some other things which probably should be said on this floor. The Racing Commission has a number of errors in their corner and they really would hate to have someone else discover this and new members of the commission might do just that.

SENATOR CLARK: Senator Dworak.

SENATOR DWORAK: Mr. President and colleagues, I think a lot of us people from the greater Nebraska area better take a very close look at this and find out just exactly what kind of marbles we are playing for because this is an important concept. This is an important piece of legislation. I disagree with Senator DeCamp in that we are stacking the court. All we are really trying to do is get some equal representation here. The court is stacked right now. The commission is stacked in favor of right now, one track. There are four other tracks that need stronger voice on this Racing Commission. Now this issue has been debated very thoroughly in two committees, Miscellaneous Subjects Committee and the Appropriations Committee through the sunset review and as Shirley Marsh indicated, as Senator Marsh indicated there is a lot of things that sort of came out through these deliberations that need to be straightened out and I think that the expansion as is in the particular piece of legislation right now is a step in the right direction to get those things cleaned up and cleaned out. I think we should have equal representation on this commission. I just can't understand
