Each member... there is no more than two can be elected from any district so that means there is no two can serve from any congressional district. We have three congressional districts so that means one has to come out of each congressional district. Grand Island would have a representation. Lincoln would have one and Omaha would have one so to speak. So I feel that clears up that area and I sure hate to see this get into the political football game. That is what would happen if we would have five members on the Racing Commission and as far as the stewards, if we would let it be handled in the commission, it would cost us an additional \$60,000 and I don't think we would want to do that. With this I will close.
