PRESIDENT: Motion fails. Anything else on the desk?

CLERK: No, sir.

PRESIDENT: We will proceed then with the Final Reading of LB 1001. All the members will return to their desks. We are still on Final Reading. Go ahead.

ASSISTANT CLERK: Final Reading of LB 1001.

PRESIDENT: All provisions of law relating to procedure having been complied with, the question is, shall LB 1001 pass with the emergency clause attached. All those in favor vote aye, opposed nay. Record the vote.

CLERK: Record vote read. (See page 1697, Legislative Journal.) 42 ayes, 4 nays, 2 excused and not voting, 1 present and not voting, Mr. President.

PRESIDENT: LB 1001 passes with the emergency clause attached. We will now go on to the next phase which I will let the Speaker explain to you.

SPEAKER MARVEL: The Clerk will read the motion on the desk.

CLERK: Mr. President, the Speaker moves to proceed with Final Reading of all bills bracketed on Final Reading which were bracketed because of the Warner "A" bill motion.

SPEAKER MARVEL: Okay, the original motion a year ago was similar to this motion and what it really does is we are an hour ahead of time, so unless there is objection, we will proceed with Final Reading and start with LB 184 and proceed down the line. The more of this we can handle the better off we are going to be in the next few days. So, is there any objection? Senator Kahle. Okay, the Clerk will read on Final Reading...Senator Keyes.

SENATOR KEYES: Do you have a list of the next three or four? I don't seem to have it on my desk.

SPEAKER MARVEL: All right, do you have your work sheet with you? No, work sheet, white work sheet.

SENATOR KEYES: Where can I get one, that is all I wanted. I want to know the next bill that is coming up.
