RECESS

SENATOR CLARK PRESIDING

SENATOR CLARK: You will come to order. You will check in please. Record.

CLERK: Quorum present, Mr. President.

SENATOR CLARK: The first bill we have on Special Order is 939. The Clerk will read the bill.

CLERK: Mr. President, if I may right before that, Senator Simon would like to print a series of amendments to LB 899 in the Journal. (See pages 1708-14 of the Journal.)

Mr. President, LB 939 was considered by the body... well first of all...(Read.) The bill was first read on January 23 of this year. It was referred to the Miscellaneous Subjects Committee for public hearing. The bill was advanced to General File. The committee amendments were adopted by the body on April 2 of this year. An amendment by Senator Sieck was adopted by the body on that day. Senator Warner had two amendments that were adopted by the body on April 2. The next amendment I have, Mr. President, is by Senator Lamb who is not with us.

SENATOR CLARK: Is Senator Lamb around?

CLERK: Well, I have others, Mr. President.

SENATOR CLARK: Do you have another one?

CLERK: Yes, sir. I have one from Senator Schmit who apparently has not checked in.

SENATOR CLARK: What is the next one?

CLERK: Senator Murphy now has an amendment, Mr. President.

SENATOR CLARK: All right, do you want to read the amendment?

CLERK: Well, whatever...Senator Murphy has two amendments, Mr. President. Would it make any difference which one first, Senator?

SENATOR CLARK: Go ahead, Senator Murphy.

SENATOR MURPHY: Mr. President, if I may, I wouldn't try to get an amendment through here on motherhood right now.
