

time, but if we would have that problem still I think that it would be appropriate to consider the Kelly amendment at that time but I would like to give them a chance to work out the problem by giving them the proper statutory guidelines and authority and restrictions and I think that is what the amendments that Senator Stoney and I will be proposing. Under Senator Kelly's amendment basically you are not getting at the root of the problem, that is those people that abuse dealers' plates. In fact, by raising the fees the 90% or however many dealers that now are currently using dealers' plates appropriately would have to pay more for those dealer plates under use that is appropriate and those people that are following the letter of the law would be harmed just as much as those that are not and so I think that you get the wrong reaction and wrong results as a result of the Kelly amendment. So I would encourage you not to support it at this time but rather to give the Stoney-Wesely amendments a chance to work and perhaps in the future would be necessary to take the action proposed by Senator Kelly but I don't think so this year.

SPEAKER MARVEL: Okay, members of the Legislature, I would like to make two or three comments to try to break this deadlock. First of all if you've got a pencil and paper I will give you a calendar for the balance of the time. Today is Tuesday, April 8th. We are meeting. Wednesday, April 9th we meet. Thursday, April 10th we meet and then we come back on Monday, April 14th. The 59th day is Tuesday, April 15th. The Governor has agreed to return whatever bills he doesn't like on the 18th. So with the six days, you've got Tuesday, Wednesday and Thursday of this week, Monday, Tuesday and Friday of next week. Does anybody have any questions? I guess we had talked about this and I had neglected to visit with you about it. Now in a few moments I would propose that we go to General File. There is about thirteen or fourteen bills, that we take fifteen minutes to discuss those bills and then if the introducer at that particular time so desires, can pose a motion to suspend the rules and vote the bill either up or down. Now if we can't do this and then if the introducer of the bill chooses not to vote the bill up or down and it runs out of time, it will go to the bottom of the heap. Sir. No, then we come to...we're not going to move this bill and I would suggest that we let the bill, 820, cool off because nobody has come up with a solution. All you come up with are ten or fifteen amendments and I just gave you the calendar and we have got to move one way or another unless you simply want to abandon all bills on General File and on Select File.
