SENATOR BEUTLER: (Mike not activated immediately.) ...cannot be called from the floor, Mr. Speaker.

SPEAKER MARVEL: Where is Senator Kelly? Senator Kelly, are you ready to vote on your amendment?

SENATOR KELLY: Mr. Speaker, if I am getting the word correctly, the automobile industry in Nebraska believes that I am bankrupting them in their inability to pay the increased costs for D plates. They prefer to have more restriction on their uses so, therefore, Mr. Chairman, Mr. Speaker, respectfully I request permission to withdraw that amendment.

SPEAKER MARVEL: Okay, Senator Kelly has the right to withdraw his amendment. What is the next amendment?

CLERK: Senator Kelly, you have a second amendment. Do you want to withdraw that one as well, Senator? Okay.

SPEAKER MARVEL: Okay, withdrawn.

CLERK: Mr. President, the next amendment is by Senator Beutler.

SPEAKER MARVEL: Senator Beutler.

SENATOR BEUTLER: What is the request number, Pat?

CLERK: 2350, Senator. That is the one you designated number one, I believe.

SENATOR BEUTLER: Mr. Speaker, members of the Legislature, I will be very brief. I suppose in this atmosphere it is going to be very hard for people to look at the substance of amendments but I really am obviously disappointed that the committee amendments were rejected and this amendment is the committee amendments with the exception of one very
