From our discussion on the committee amendments it seemed to me that probably what most people objected to was the fact that we were changing the composition of the board to include some additional public members. I really do again feel strongly about the Consumer Protection Act and the Deceptive Trade Practices Act and some of the arguably, very arguably anticompetitive aspects of the advertising code and those would be retained in this amendment but again we would reject everything having to do with the change in the composition of the board. I would be glad to answer any questions. I don't want to take up any more time than is necessary to get a decision on this though. Thank you.

SPEAKER MARVEL: The motion before the House is the adoption of the Beutler amendment to 820. Any further discussion. All those in favor of that motion vote aye, opposed vote no. Have you all voted? Have you all voted? I am going to call the question. Record the vote.

CLERK: 8 ayes, 24 nays, Mr. President.

SPEAKER MARVEL: The motion fails. What is the next amendment?

CLERK: Mr. President, I now have a second Beutler amendment, request #2351, Senator.

SENATOR BEUTLER: Mr. Speaker, members of the Legislature, this amendment further deletes the committee amendments and basically where we are now is that this would make the Consumer Protection Act and the Deceptive Trade Practices Act applicable to the motor vehicle industries and it would eliminate the anticompetitive aspects of the advertising code. The changes to the board are eliminated. The provision having to do with legal counsel being in the Attorney General's office is eliminated, almost all the other provisions of the committee amendments have been eliminated. And I guess I would ask you to please try to take a look at the substance of what we are doing. You know we are coming into these last days and we are talking about fifteen minutes on a bill and I guess in my mind I am wondering, what is the rush. I would rather that we spent the time that was needed on each bill and come out of here with some quality bills than trying to push through a whole bunch of bills in fifteen minutes. I have the very distinct feeling now that we are rushing through this bill no one is listening to any of the amendments and I guess I am wondering what
