SPEAKER MARVEL: Senator Keyes.

SENATOR KEYES: Mr. Speaker, I have been rather quiet today but I want to ask one question. What rule are we suspending now? Is it the same one that we suspended twice this morning?

SPEAKER MARVEL: If you've got your rule book there we are talking basically about Rule 7, Section 7 on page 41 of the rule book.

SENATOR KEYES: And that is the same one we suspended this morning. Am I not right?

SPEAKER MARVEL: It has been a long time since this morning. I don't really remember.

SENATOR KEYES: Well it is the same one that we suspended this morning and never since I have been here have I ever heard that the rules have been reinstated. If we suspend the rules on that first specific bill that we just suspended, why, I think we would have to reinstate the rule once in a while before...we've been operating here today without those rules and why don't we go ahead now and operate without them? I never heard of a single soul saying, hey, Orval, hey, Mr. Speaker, we put that bill back into effect, that rule hasn't been put into effect so we have been operating all morning without it. We haven't needed it. Now is the first time we need it. Let's go ahead and use it or else suspend it.
