

DeCamp's motion as collapsing in to the kind of motion that is contemplated on page 41 and that he shouldn't be able to do it unless he has unanimous consent because otherwise he is evading not only this rule, but all other rules that take more than 30 votes to do things and we can't permit that to happen. I would have preferred the Speaker ruled it out of order. Since he has not done that I move to overrule the Speaker. Thank you, Mr. Speaker.

SPEAKER MARVEL: Okay, the question is, shall the Chair be overruled. All those in favor of overruling the Chair vote aye, opposed vote no. Have you all voted? A record vote is requested. Senator Hoagland. Record the vote.

CLERK: 17 ayes, 26 nays on the motion to overrule the Chair. I'm sorry, we wanted a record vote. Was that Senator Cullan? Senator Haberman, excuse me. (Read record vote as found on page 1725 of the Journal.) 17 ayes, 26 nays, Mr. President, on the motion to overrule the Chair.

SPEAKER MARVEL: Motion lost. Do you want to read the motion?

CLERK: Well the motion as I understand it now, Mr. President, is suspend the rules, specifically Rule 7, Section 7a and Rule 6, Section 7 and 9 and to provide that LB 637 shall be reconsidered.

SPEAKER MARVEL: Senator DeCamp, do you want to close on your motion? I'm sorry.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Mr. Chairman, we have three propositions here. One is to suspend certain sections of Rule 6. One of those provisions to be suspended deals with what happens to a bill that has the emergency clause, then we come to a suspension of Rule 7 which would allow a reconsideration under these circumstances but it does not touch the requirements relative to an emergency clause and then the final part of the motion which says the reconsideration. I think what ought to be done is to split some of these things out so that the only thing before us is a move to reconsider and the suspension of 6, 7 and 9 are not necessary to a vote on whether there should be a reconsideration. I am asking for a division of the question.

SPEAKER MARVEL: The Chair recognizes Senator Murphy.
