PRESIDENT: All right, the motion. . . any discussion on the motion to confirm the appointment of Hal Daub? Chair recognizes Senator Merz.

SENATOR MERZ: Thank you.

SENATOR MARSH: It is on page 1668, Senator.

PRESIDENT: Any further discussion? All right, the motion before the House is the motion to confirm the appointment of Hal Daub. All those in favor vote aye, opposed vote nay. Senator Keyes.

SENATOR KEYES: Yes, I would just like to ask Senator Marsh a question.

PRESIDENT: Senator Marsh, would you respond to Senator Keyes?

SENATOR MARSH: Certainly.

SENATOR KEYES: Senator Marsh, who recommended Hal? I call him Hal because I know him well enough to call him by his first name.

SENATOR MARSH: All of us did, Senator.

SENATOR KEYES: When you say "all of us", who is. . . .

SENATOR MARSH: On page 1668 of the Legislative Journal. I'll read those names again. Senators Marsh, Simon, Cope, Cullan, Kennedy, Lewis, Nichol, Reutzel recommend him to the legislative body.
