Well what purpose is there in having these religious programs if somebody goes to them, tries to make a change, which is what we see we are about and then this man that is supposed to be the judge is going to disparage the individual, and then disparage the people who try to help him. Now we have a page where a parole member asks a question of an individual named Zelenski, and Greenholtz interrupts, "Oh, banana nose, you know what he is talking about." Now suppose you have one of those names that ends in an "I" and you are standing before an individual who is to be a judge and have power over your destiny and your name is Venditte but he doesn't like you, so he says you know what he is talking about banana nose. You got to stand there, drop your eyes and grit your teeth and don't let there be a tremor on your face to show any indignation and say yes, sir, yes, sir, Mr. Greenholtz, I, banana nose, know what he is talking about. Is that what the Legislature is interested in? Senator Lamb, these things are excerpts from actual hearings that are transcribed. Then we have another case, to show how personally involved Greenholtz gets, and he is supposed to be objective.

PRESIDENT: One minute, Senator Chambers.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: You have got a majority of the board vote, let me tell you this. I'll never vote for another parole for you. So don't get any ideas that you have conned anyone. You don't deserve anything. That is the judge. That is the man that we are being asked to support. There are many pages here. When you all hear me say things on this floor, there is a difference between me saying it here where you can talk back to me and a parole chairman saying it to a person who is totally at his control, under his control and at his mercy which Mr. Greenholtz lacks any of. Remember this for those of you all who can't distinguish between being tough and being a bully, the parole hearing is not to be a part of the statutory punishment imposed on an individual. The law would prohibit the penal officials from brow beating and berating inmates as a part of their punishment in the way that John Greenholtz does when he is supposed to be conducting an objective and fair hearing. I'm opposed to Mr. Greenholtz's reappointment and if any of you would have any interest you should read this material and see the way he has conducted himself. His own conduct condemns him more than anything else anyone else could say.
